AGE GROUP COMPETITIONS

Effective September 1, 2023

Updated November 2, 2023

CDAG 1.0 GENERAL

CDAG 1.1 Diving Plongeon Canada (DPC) has adopted portions of World Aquatics (formerly known as FINA) Section IV.12 Age Group Rules for Age Group Diving competitions held in Canada **AND**

CDAG 1.2 To meet our domestic objectives, address our national development philosophies and support clubs to host various diving competitions in Canada, DPC has adapted the World Aquatics (AQUA) Age Group Diving rules of competition by applying specific Canadian interpretations and adding new rules.

CDAG 1.2.1 Where a conflict occurs, the Canadian interpretation and Rules shall apply.

CDAG 1.2.2 Where no DPC Age Group Competition Rule (CDAG) rule is stated, the AQUA rule shall apply. Refer to: <https://www.worldaquatics.com/rules> for all AQUA Diving Rules

CDAG 1.2.3 Questions regarding these Rules should be directed to the Junior High Performance Director (JHPD).

CDAG 1.3 Diver Designations

CDAG 1.3.1 Canadian

Any Canadian citizen (by birth or naturalization) who is a registered participant of DPC OR a diver who holds a Sport Nationality CANADA (defined in **AQUA rules Section 1.3 Sport Nationality**) is eligible to register, compete, be ranked and receive medals/ribbons in DPC Age Group sanctioned competitions. If applicable, they are also eligible to tally individual, team and club points for the purposes of overall top diver and club awards. They are designated as Canadians.

CDAG 1.3.2 Exhibition

Any diver who is not a Canadian citizen, but registered with DPC through an affiliated club in a Member Province AND who does not hold any other country's Sport Nationality (as defined in **AQUA rules Section 1.3 Sport Nationality**), is eligible to register, compete, share ranking and receive medals/ribbons in DPC Age Group sanctioned competitions. This diver is eligible to tally their points for the purposes of overall top club awards only. This diver is not eligible for overall top diver awards.

They will be designated as **Exhibition** in all results. If the diver becomes a Canadian citizen by naturalization, they will be considered the same as divers described in **CDAG 1.3.1**.

CDAG 1.3.3 Visitor

CDAG 1.3.3.1 Any diver who is not a Canadian citizen and holds a Sport Nationality (as defined in **AQUA rules Section I.3 Sport Nationality**) of a World Aquatics member in good standing may be permitted to register, compete, share ranking and receive medals/ribbons in DPC Age Group sanctioned competitions. This diver is **not** eligible to tally individual, team and club points for the purposes of overall top diver and club awards. They will be designated as **Visitor** in all results. Application must be submitted to the DPC Office at least 14 days prior to the registration deadline of the competition.

CDAG 1.3.3.2 Any diver who holds dual citizenship AND a Sport Nationality (as defined in **AQUA rules Section I.3 Sport Nationality**) of a World Aquatics member in good standing (other than CANADA) may be permitted to register, compete, share rank and receive medals/ribbons in sanctioned DPC Age Group competitions. This diver is **not** eligible to tally their points for the purposes of overall top diver and club awards. This diver will be designated as **Visitor** in all results. Application must be submitted to the DPC Office at least 14 days prior to the registration deadline of the competition. Once their status and eligibility has been determined, it will remain in effect for the remainder of their diving career or until their Sport Nationality is officially changed (as per **AQUA rules in Section I.3 Sport Nationality**).

NOTE: Contact the DPC Office for more information about registering dual citizens or non-Canadians for any sanctioned events or competitions in Canada.

CDAG 1.4 Coach Eligibility

To be on deck and in the dryland areas actively coaching divers registered in DPC sanctioned competitions and events, coaches shall:

- a) be registered participants in good standing with DPC through a member province and an affiliated club AND
- b) have completed all Safe Sport training and Screening requirements as per the Coach Screening Policy and Operational Guidelines AND
- c) Meet or exceed the minimum National Coaching Certification Program status when attending the following events/competitions:
 - i. Affiliated Intra-club – Instruction Beginner Trained

- ii. Intra-provincial Development events (Aspire, Tier 2, Novice, Espoir, etc. with in-province participants only) – Instruction Beginner Trained
- iii. Inter-Provincial Development Invitationals – Instruction Beginner Certified or Competition-Introduction In-Training
- iv. Age Group Invitationals & Junior Qualifying Competitions – Competition-Introduction Trained
- v. Junior Nationals – Competition-Introduction Certified
- vi. Junior Special Trials - Competition-Development Trained

NOTE: All visiting coaches or coaches who do not meet the above eligibility standards may apply for an exemption. Exemptions will have expiration dates and conditions. Coaches who repeatedly do not comply with the conditions will not be permitted to coach athletes in the competition and may be asked to leave the facility. Please contact the DPC Coach Development Manager (tracy@diving.ca) for more information.

CDAG 1.5 Provincial Sections and clubs hosting invitational and local competitions may set special entrance and dive list requirements for developmental, Age Group and other invitational events. The Meet Information Package shall include all changes to, or specific application of AQUA and/or DPC rules and regulations.

CDAG 1.6 Refer to **DPC Event Sanctioning & Hosting** for more information regarding hosting requirements and responsibilities.

CDAG 1.7 Unless otherwise stated in a Meet Information Package, the following Canada Diving Age Group (CDAG) rules will apply to:

- a) Age Group Invitationals
- b) Junior Qualification Competitions
- c) Junior Elite Nationals
- d) Junior Development Nationals
- e) Junior Special Trials

CDAG 2.0 CATEGORIES

CDAG 2.1 Categories by Birth Year (Age Groups)

At competitions in Canada, each diver shall compete in groups categorized by their year of birth, known as Age Groups.

NOTE: Junior-aged divers may dive in Open or Senior events however, they must adhere to the dive list requirements for that category. Therefore, these events may not be considered as Junior Qualification events regardless of the dives performed.

CDAG 2.2 Categories by Gender

Each Age Group will be separated into Boys and Girls events (i.e., D1 Boys, C2 Girls).

CDAG 2.3 Category Events

Individual events offered at each competition may include preliminary and final sessions for 1 Meter, 3 Meter and Platform. Unless otherwise stated in the Meet Information Package, each category's events will be conducted using the following procedures.

See **CDAG 4.1.2.9 for guidelines to combine events where there is a low number of entries for any single event.

Group D

Preliminaries

- There will be separate D1 and D2 preliminary events.
- D1 and D2 share warm-up time.
- The D1 event goes first followed 5 minutes later by the D2 competition.
- If requested, divers are permitted 1-2 jumps in between D1 and D2 events.
- Competition hosts may choose to use these results for final ranking and awards.

Finals

- There will be one (1) Group D Final comprised of the top three (3) divers from the D1 Preliminaries and the top five (5) divers from the D2 Preliminaries.
- Should there be a Finals spot not filled (insufficient divers in D1 or D2), the next diver(s) in ranking order from Preliminaries will advance to the Final session.
- See **CDAG 4.2.5** for rules regarding Exhibition and Visiting divers in Finals
- The finalists will compete in the reverse order of their ranking determined by the total scores at the end of the Preliminary session, starting with the D1 divers and followed by the D2 divers.

Group C

Preliminaries

- There will be separate C1 and C2 preliminary events.
- C1 and C2 share warm-up time.
- The C1 event goes first followed 5 minutes later by the C2 competition.
- If requested, divers are permitted 1-2 jumps in between D1 and D2 events.
- Competition hosts may choose to use these results for final ranking and awards.

Finals

- There will be one (1) Group C Final comprised of the top four (4) divers from the C1 Preliminaries and the top six (6) divers from the C2 Preliminaries
- Should there be a Finals spot not filled (insufficient divers in C1 or C2), the next diver(s) in ranking order from Preliminaries will advance to the Final session
- See **CDAG 4.2.5** for rules regarding Exhibition and Visiting divers in Finals
- The finalists will compete in the reverse order of their ranking determined by the total scores at the end of the Preliminary session, starting with the C1 divers and followed by the C2 divers.

Group B & A

Preliminaries

- Competition hosts may choose to use these results for final ranking and awards.

Finals

- The top ten (10) ranked divers from Preliminaries will advance to Finals.
- See **CDAG 4.2.5** for rules regarding Exhibition and Visiting divers in Finals.
- The scores of the dives with limit from Preliminaries will be carried forward to the Final session.
- In the Final session, the divers will compete in the reverse order of their ranking determined by the total scores at the end of the Preliminary session.

NOTE: To advance to a final session: where there is a tie for a last spot by Canadian divers, both divers will advance to the final, thus increasing the final session numbers. Example: There is a C1 4th place tie AND a C2 6th place tie, the final will have 12 Canadian divers.

CDAG 3.0 DIVE REQUIREMENTS

Each diver shall perform a full list of dives as indicated in their Category for each of the sessions defined in the Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.0 GENERAL RULES FOR AGE GROUP COMPETITIONS

CDAG 4.1 Competitions

CDAG 4.1.1 Affiliated Club and Provincial Invitationals

Clubs and Provincials Sections may invite divers, coaches, judges and team support personnel to attend Age Group competitions. Costs associated with promoting, hosting, judges and awards are the responsibility of the Competition Host. See **DPC Event Sanctioning and Hosting** for more details.

CDAG 4.1.1.1 Affiliated Club events and Invitational Competition Hosts may determine the diving events offered at their competition, set fees, determine deadlines for entries and shall post a tentative schedule in their Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.1.1.2 Hosts choosing not to use the CDAG Age Group Competition Rules for events AND/OR if they add categories and requirements (Novice, Tier

2, Aspire, Espoir, Group E/F, etc.), shall clearly outline all requirements and adapted rules in the Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.1.1.3 Each participating club will be responsible for registering their participants and submitting the statement of dives for each diver using the prescribed method, by the deadline stated in the Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.1.1.4 The Provincial Section will assign a minimum Level 2 Official as the Meet Referee who will act as the Chair of the Meet Jury of Appeal and construct the judging panels. Travel and accommodation costs for the Meet Referee will be provided by the Competition Host. For more information about judging diving in Canada, refer to the DPC Competition Regulations, the DPC Officials Development Pathway and the DPC Rules – Judging.

CDAG 4.1.1.5 If the Invitational is sanctioned as a Junior Qualification Competition, the Age Group events shall follow the CDAG Rules for Junior Qualification Competitions listed in **CDAG 4.1.2**.

CDAG 4.1.2 Junior Qualification Competitions

Provincial Sections may apply for sanction for up to two (2) Junior Qualification Competitions in the competition year in the months of December, January, February, March, May and June. Costs associated with promoting, hosting, judges and awards are the responsibility of the Competition Host. See **DPC Event Sanctioning and Hosting** for more details.

CDAG 4.1.2.1 DPC reserves the right to consult with the Provincial Sections and Clubs to create a calendar of events that provides adequate and reasonable opportunities for divers to qualify for Junior National Championships and Special Trials.

CDAG 4.1.2.2 All Junior Qualification Competitions must be completed at least ten (10) days prior to the first day of competition of a Junior National Championships.

NOTE: Exceptions will be considered. Contact the JHPD to apply for a special consideration.

CDAG 4.1.2.3 The DPC Officials Committee will assign an out of province Level 4 or 5 Official as the Meet Referee who will act as the Chair of the Meet Jury of Appeal, construct the judging panels and verify all final Qualification event results. Travel, food and accommodation costs for the Meet Referee will be provided by DPC.

CDAG 4.1.2.4 Provincial Sections or Host Clubs are responsible to ensure there is a sufficient number of qualified judges in attendance to meet the Judging Panel requirements described in **CDAG 4.1.2.5**. Travel, food and accommodations costs for judges shall be the responsibility of the Provincial Section and/or Host Club to arrange. For more information about Officiating, refer to the DPC Officials Program Manual.

CDAG 4.1.2.5 All judging panels for individual Junior Qualification events will have a minimum of five (5) judges. Of the 5 judges:

- two (2) judges shall be Level 3, 4 or 5 Officials
- no more than one (1) judge shall be a Level 1 Official
- no more than three (3) judges shall be Level 2 Officials
- no more than two (2) judges shall be registered and Trained NCCP Competition-Introduction (or higher) Coaches

CDAG 4.1.2.6 A seven (7) judge panel may be used as a minimum for synchronized diving events with four (4) judges for execution and three (3) judges for synchronization. All three (3) synchronization judges must be a qualified Level 2 or higher Official. The four (4) execution judges may be any combination of Comp-Intro coaches or Level 1 or higher Officials.

NOTE: Efforts shall be made to have as few coaches on all judging panels as possible. If coaches are required to judge due to a low number of qualified judges present, the coach should not be actively coaching divers in the event while judging.

CDAG 4.1.2.7 Meet Information Packages shall be sent to DPC a minimum of sixty (60) days prior to the registration deadline.

CDAG 4.1.2.8 Each participating club will be responsible for registering their participants and submitting the statement of dives for each diver using the prescribed method, by the deadline stated in the Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.1.2.8.1 Divers entering Age Group Qualification events must adhere to the requirements listed in **CDAG Age Group Dive Requirements**.

CDAG 4.1.2.8.2 Dives with prescribed DDs, dives with DD limit and dives without limit must be performed in the same order as required for the preliminary event at the Junior National Championships.

CDAG 4.1.2.9 Guidelines for combining events at Competitions

CDAG 4.1.2.9.1 It is permitted to combine boys and girls of the same Age Group in one event if any one gender has 3 or fewer divers or if there are 8 or fewer boys and girls combined. The boys shall start the event with Round 1, then the girls shall perform Round 1, etc.

CDAG 4.1.2.9.2 It is permitted to combine C1 and C2 if either Age Group has 3 or fewer divers entered or if there 8 or fewer divers entered in C1 and C2 combined. C2 divers shall start the event with Round 1, then C1 shall perform Round 1, C2 performs Round 2, etc.

CDAG 4.1.2.9.3 It is permitted to combine D1 and D2 if either Age Group has 3 or fewer divers entered or if there 8 or fewer divers entered in D1 and D2 combined. D2 divers shall start the event with Round 1, then D1 shall perform Round 1, D2 performs Round 2, etc.

CDAG 4.1.2.9.4 It is not permitted to combine Age Group C with Age Group D.

CDAG 4.1.2.9.5 It is permitted to combine one gender of A with the same gender of B if either Age Group has 3 or fewer divers entered or if there are 8 or fewer divers entered in A and B combined. The A divers will start the event with Round 1, then B shall perform Round 1, etc.

CDAG 4.1.2.9.6 If any age groups or genders are combined for the competition, they shall be separated for results and awards.

CDAG 4.1.2.9.7 For any other combination of events, please contact the JHPD or the Domestic Officials Manager for authorization.

CDAG 4.1.2.10 Results from Junior Qualification Competitions must be reported to DPC within seven (7) days of the final event.

CDAG 4.1.3 Junior National Championships

There shall be two Age Group National Championships held:

- Junior Elite Nationals (Age Groups A & B)
- Junior Development Nationals (Age Groups C & D)

CDAG 4.1.3.1 DPC reserves the right to consult with the Provincial Sections and Clubs to determine the best location, dates and co-hosts for these competitions.



CDAG 4.1.3.2 DPC reserves the right to combine the two championships into one event (i.e. Junior Diving Festival).

NOTE: Efforts will be made to host one (1) Junior national level competition in British Columbia / Alberta / Saskatchewan / Manitoba and one (1) Junior national level competition in Manitoba / Ontario/ Quebec / Atlantic each season. See **DPC Event Sanctioning and Hosting** for more information.

CDAG 4.1.3.3 Registration Form

Each club will be responsible for registering their participants for the competition using the prescribed method outlined in the Meet Information Package, ten (10) days prior to the start of the first day of competition.

The following information must be included on the club registration form and completed for each diver:

- Name of Club
- Name of diver
- Diver Registration Number
- Age Group of diver
- Name of diver's coach
- Coach registration number
- Gender of the diver
- Events each diver will submit a statement of dives
- Proof of Qualification for each event entered (upon request)
- Signed Code of Conduct (upon request)
- Calculation of Registration and Entry Fees

CDAG 4.1.3.4 The penalty for incomplete or late registration forms is \$250 and payable to DPC in addition to the Registration and Entry fees.

CDAG 4.1.3.5 Registration and Entry Fees

Registration and Entry Fees shall be paid to DPC via credit card (VISA, Mastercard, Diners Club), cheque or etransfer ten (10) days prior to the posted start time of the first competition.

Registration Fee per Diver - \$85

Entry Fee per Event per Diver - \$85

Entry Fee per Synchro Team - \$85

CDAG 4.1.3.6 Requests for Refund of Entry Fees must be received within 30 days of the last day of the competition. Refunds of Entry Fees will be permitted if a pre-registered athlete:

- does not travel to the competition
- is unable to compete due to an on-site injury/illness and provides a health professional's certificate confirming the injury or illness

NOTE: Registration Fees are non-refundable

CDAG 4.1.3.7 Statement of Dives

Each diver, or their representative is responsible for submitting their statement of dives using the prescribed method, 24 hours prior to the posted start time of the first event of the competition. (See **DPC Competition Regulations D 4.0 Statement of Dives** for more information about the Statement of Dives).

CDAG 4.1.3.8 The DPC Technical Committee will assign a Level 4 or 5 Official as the Meet Referee who will act as the Chair of the Meet Jury of Appeal and construct the judging panels.

CDAG 4.1.3.9 DPC is responsible to ensure there are enough Level 3, 4 and 5 Officials assigned to the competition so that all individual events will have a minimum of seven (7) judges, 1 event referee and 1 assistant referee. Travel, food, and accommodations costs for the assigned Level 4 and 5 officials shall be the responsibility of DPC. For more information about Officiating, refer to the **DPC Officials Program Manual**.

CDAG 4.1.3.10 Schedule Regulations

CDAG 4.1.3.10.1 Unless otherwise posted in advance of the competition, the competition boards will have restricted practice for a minimum of ½ hour and a maximum of one (1) hour for the divers in the upcoming event.

CDAG 4.1.3.10.2 When the final time schedule for the diving events has been circulated to all clubs participating, no event shall start more than one half hour (30 minutes) before the starting time posted.

CDAG 4.1.3.10.3 Unless prior permission is granted, where simultaneous events are held, no practice will be allowed on open boards until the conclusion of both simultaneous events.

CDAG 4.1.3.10.4 Unless stated otherwise at the Technical Meeting, if a change to the schedule must be made contrary to the rules, or to start events more than 30 minutes earlier than scheduled, the Meet Referee, in consultation with at least 2 members of the Meet Jury of Appeal, will determine the new start times. The final decision to change the schedule is the authority of the Meet Referee. The responsibility of communicating the new start times to one coach from each participating club is the responsibility of the host technical chairperson.

CDAG 4.1.4 Junior Special Trials

DPC shall host, co-host, or designate competitions for the purpose of talent identification, selecting Junior National Team members or international event teams.

CDAG 4.1.4.1 DPC reserves the right to establish eligibility criteria for these Special Trial competitions.

CDAG 4.1.4.2 The Event Registration, Entry Procedures and Submission of Dive Lists for Special Trials will follow the Junior National Championships Rules unless otherwise stated in the Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.1.4.3 The schedule, scoring and final results will follow the Junior National Championship Rules unless otherwise stated in the Meet Information Package or the specific event's selection criteria.

CDAG 4.1.4.4 Direct questions regarding any Special Trials to the JPHD or the Technical Committee.

CDAG 4.2 Diver Eligibility

CDAG 4.2.1 Age Group Competitions

To enter an Invitational or Junior Qualifying competition, a diver must:

- a) be a registered DPC participant in good standing 30 days prior to the start of the first day of competition (Canadian or Exhibition) OR
- b) be a registered participant in good standing with written confirmation from DPC that they are a Visitor.

CDAG 4.2.2 Junior National Championships

To enter an individual event at Junior National Championship, a diver must:

- a) meet the criteria in **CDAG 4.2.1 a or b AND**
- b) have qualified based on one (1) or more of the following criteria:
 - i. Any diver making finals on 1 metre, 3 metre or platform at the

most recent World Junior Championships will be permitted to enter all events.

- ii. Any diver who is a member of the current Junior or Senior National Team will be permitted to enter all events.
- iii. Any diver who achieves the **Junior National Qualification Standards** for their Age Group category at a designated Junior Qualifying Competition during the preceding twelve (12) months will be permitted to enter that event at Junior Nationals.

NOTES:

- D1, D2, C1 and C2 Qualification Standards are achieved with the preliminary dive list (See CDAG Junior Dive Requirements)
- If a diver achieves the qualification standard on 3M, the diver is permitted to enter the 1M event
- If a diver achieves the qualification standard for 2 events, the diver is permitted to enter the 3rd event

CDAG 4.2.3 Junior Special Trials

To enter a Junior Special Trials event, a diver must:

- a) Be a Canadian citizen by birth or naturalization, with no other Sport Nationality (as defined in **AQUA Rules Section I.3.0 Sport Nationality**)
- b) be a DPC registered participant in good standing 30 days prior to the start of the first day of competition AND
- c) have qualified for the Special Trials based on a pre-determined criteria OR received a written invitation from DPC.

CDAG 4.2.4 Special Consideration

Divers requesting entry to any Invitational competition, Junior National Championships or Junior Special Trials who have not met the criteria above must apply in writing to JHPD fourteen (14) days before the entry deadline of the competition. A copy of the written confirmation of acceptance from the JHPD shall be submitted to the Competition Secretariat. Registration late fee will not be required if the diver is granted permission to enter the competition.

CDAG 4.2.5 Exhibition and Visiting Divers - Post-preliminary Advancement, Ranking and Awards

CAGD 4.2.5.1 Visiting and Exhibition divers may advance to a semi-final or final competition.

CDAG 4.2.5.2 Visiting and Exhibition divers cannot displace a Canadian diver in any individual final competition. If any Visiting or Exhibition divers qualify for a post preliminary session, that session's number of divers will increase accordingly so that a full complement of Canadian divers are in the post preliminary event.

CDAG 4.2.5.3 Visiting and Exhibition divers are eligible to receive duplicate ranking and medals/awards. (i.e., All divers will be ranked and any Visiting and Exhibition divers, even if they have higher final total score, shall receive the same award as the next lower ranked Canadian diver).

CDAG 4.2.5.5 If at least one diver of a synchronized team is a Canadian, the team is eligible for their own medal/ribbon (do not have to share ranking). However, they are not, as a team, eligible for selection purposes. The club can tally points for the Canadian diver only.

CDAG 4.3 Results

For all Competitions, summary results will be published for both Girls and Boys in each 1M, 3M and Platform in each Age Category. Detailed Results should be made available upon request.

Group D

1. Group D1 Preliminaries
2. Group D2 Preliminaries
3. Group D Finals
 - Ranking based on Finals scores only
 - Only the Finalists will be ranked for awards

Group C

1. Group C1 Preliminaries
2. Group C2 Preliminaries
3. Group C Finals
 - Ranking based on Finals scores only
 - Only the Finalists will be ranked for awards

Group B

1. Group B Preliminaries
2. Group B Finals
 - Ranking based on Finals Score (determined by adding the scores for the dives with D.D. limit from the Preliminaries and the scores for the dives without D.D. limit from the Final)
 - Only the Finalists will be ranked for awards

Group A

1. Group A Preliminaries
2. Group A Finals
 - Ranking based on Finals Score (determined by adding the scores for the dives with D.D. limit from the Preliminaries and the scores for the dives without D.D. limit from the Final)
 - Only the Finalists will be ranked for awards

CDAG 4.4 Awards

CDAG 4.4.1 Invitationals and Qualifying Competitions

CDAG 4.4.1.1 Provincial Sections and Club hosts shall determine the number of placings and provide the type of award (medals, ribbons, gifts) that will be acknowledged in the awards ceremonies for individual, synchronized diving and clubs.

CDAG 4.4.1.2 Overall Diver and Club awards ranking and points systems, if different than stated in **CDAG 4.4.2.2** and **CDAG 4.4.2.4** shall be clearly described in the Meet Information Package.

CDAG 4.4.2 Junior National Championships

CDAG 4.4.2.1 All individual finalists shall be acknowledged.

CDAG 4.4.2.1.1 Medals for first to third place shall be supplied by DPC and shall be presented by the Host Committee, to the divers placing in the top three (3) overall in each event in each Age Group.

CDAG 4.4.2.1.2 Appropriate awards for the remaining finalists shall be supplied and presented by the Host Committee to the remaining finalists in each event in each Age Group.

CDAG 4.4.2.2 Outstanding Canadian Diver Awards

CDAG 4.4.2.2.1 An award for the Outstanding Canadian Diver of each Age Group (male and female) at the Junior National Championships will be given by DPC (12 awards total).

CDAG 4.4.2.2.2 DPC will present an award for the Outstanding Canadian Diver of each Age Group (male and female) at the Junior National Championships (12 awards total).

- Eligible divers must be a Canadian citizen and have no other Sport Nationality.
- Using the **Diver Chart of Points**:
 - o For Age Group A, the placing points achieved the top two (2) Final events will be added together for each diver.
 - o For Age Group B, the placing points acquired in the three (3) Final events will be added together for each diver.
 - o For Age Group D1, D2, C1 and C2, the placing points acquired in the three (3) preliminary events will be added together for each diver.
- The diver with the highest total placing points will be named the Outstanding Canadian Diver for that age group.
- In the event of a tie in placing points, an accumulative total of their scoring points will determine the winner. If a tie remains, both divers will receive the award.

CDAG 4.4.2.3 Isabel Warren Award

An award for the Canadian divers with the highest point total for the dives with limit in Girls B and Boys B will be given. The 1m, 3m and Platform events will be used to calculate the top scores. This award is presented by the Etobicoke Diving Club and funded by the Isabel Warren Trust Fund.

CDAG 4.4.2.4 Club Awards

DPC shall also supply a pennant to be awarded by the Host Committee at the conclusion of the championships to the club that has accumulated the most club points over all events in the championships. The club points shall be determined by the ranking points acquired by each club based on the placing points of each diver. Refer to the Chart of Points for each Age Group and the Chart of Points for Club Rankings. Awards will be presented for:

- Junior Development club (Age Group D & C)
- Junior Elite club (Age Group B&A)
- Overall Best club (Development and Elite Club together)
