REGISTRATION AND ENTRY PROCESS

All participants <u>MUST</u> register with the LOC in order to be able to participate in the event.

- Preliminary Entry Form is due before March 6th.
- Final Entry Form and Travel Form are both due before March 27th.
- Note that the LOC is also requesting to see proof of valid travel/medical insurance prior to arrival for all delegations. Please send your certificate before March 27th.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

VISA-eTA PROCESS

Citizens of certain countries and territories need a visa or an eTA to visit or transit Canada.

Note. If you hold a passport other than Canadian or you are stateless, you need a visa to visit or transit in Canada. Canada has introduced a requirement for countries that previously did not require a visa to enter Canada. An Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) is an entry requirement for visa-exempt foreign nationals traveling to Canada by air. An eTA is electronically linked to a traveler's passport. It is valid for up to five years or until the passport expires, whichever comes first.

Please note that in the current context, we expect that issuing visas will take much longer than in the past and we urge you to begin this process as early as possible to avoid possible travel problems due to delays.

AIRPORT

All arrivals and departures <u>MUST</u> be done to and from the <u>Calgary International Airport</u> (YYC). The LOC will have an information booth in the international terminal. Please see Diving Canada's staff at the desk when arriving in Calgary.

Please be reminded that transportation to/from the airport will only be coordinated if the flight information is entered correctly and sent to canadacup@diving.ca on time by March 27th.

PARTICIPANT FULL-BOARD COSTS

Full board hospitality will begin with dinner on April 28th and end with lunch on May 6th, 2024.

Prices include hotel accommodations, event entry fees, transportation, and meals during the team's stay. Hotel accommodations offered are in single or double. Three meals a day beginning with dinner on your check-in day (pending arrival time) and ending with lunch on your check-out day (pending your departure time). All fees are USD.

TRANSPORTATION

Free transportation is only provided for athletes, coaches and accompanying persons having booked at the official event hotel with the LOC.

Transportation will be provided to and from the airport as well as between the hotel and the venue.

Transportation between the hotel and the venue can be done via shuttles, c-train, and is also walkable distance.

50% of the overall payment: March 6th, 2024

The remaining balance: March 27th, 2024

Any cancellations after April 11th (three weeks before) are subject to a cancellation fee of \$100.00 USD per person.

Any cancellations after April 18th (two weeks before) are subject to pay their first two days of participation costs.

*All participants not staying at the host hotel will be subject to a \$350 USD per person competition fee, to be paid by the final entry deadline of March 27th.

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COMPETITION FORMAT

The Canada Cup of Diving will be implementing a **NEW** competition format with the aim to provide more competitive opportunities for participating athletes and coaches.

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

3M and 10M events for both men (6 dives without limit) and women (5 dives without limit) will be contested. These events will include a preliminary session, a repechage round, and a final.

SYNCHRONIZED EVENTS

3M and 10M events for both men (2 dives with limit + 4 dives without limit) and women (2 dives with limit + 3 dives without limit) will be contested.

These events will be contested as a straight final, and countries are permitted to enter one team per event, but a 2nd entry can be considered depending on event size.

Medals will be presented to the top-3 teams regardless of nationality.

AQUA RECOGNIZED EVENT COMPETITION RULES

RULES

With the exception of the competition format mentioned on the previous page, all other World Aquatics Rules are in place at the event (i.e. regarding judging, degrees of difficulty, dive groups, nationality, eligibility, etc.). You can find the World Aquatics Rules HERE.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The Canada Cup of Diving shall be open to all AQUA affiliated Federations.
- Entries of divers in the Canada Cup of Diving shall be accepted only from the Federations, Members of AQUA.
- Divers age 12 and 13 years on December 31st of the same year shall be eligible to participate (as per age group C).
- The maximum number of divers who can participate in an individual event per nation is six (6).
- No additional divers or teams may participate, other than those specified in the Rules & Regulations. There will be no opportunity for exhibition places.

JUDGES

- The Event shall be judged by World Aquatics Certified A or G judges.
- A Federation taking part in the Canada Cup with a team of three (3) divers or more must send a World Aquatics Certified A or G level judge.
- This judge might, however, also serve as a coach provided that this is not for an event where he/she is judging.
- A Federation with fewer than three (3) divers is permitted to be send an A or G level judge.

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MEDICAL SERVICES

Lifeguards will be on duty at all training/competition sessions and will act as the first responders.

A medical clinic is situated at the competition venue and offers service on a pay per use basis. A physician will be available to participants by contacting the organizing committee's medical services coordinator.

Physio tables will be available for visiting countries to use at both the competition venue and host hotel.

On-site medical services will be available to all participants from April 29 to May 5. In case of an emergency, the EMS will decide which hospital the patient will be transferred to depending on the type of injury or illness.

More information will be provided in a future communication.

DOPING CONTROL

Doping control procedures will be in place at the competition.

Divers are responsible for bringing government-issued photo ID (or a high-resolution copy) in case they are selected for doping control. Divers are also responsible for any medication/supplement they are taking. Athletes under 18 must have a chaperone from their team to accompany them during their test.
