COMPETITION FORMAT

INDIVIDUAL EVENTS

- Events held at this championship will include individual (men and women) 1M springboard, 3M springboard and platform.
 - For all events, men will perform 6 dives and women will perform 5 dives as per Diving Canada rules.
- There will be a preliminary and a final.
 - The top 8 divers from the prelims will advance to the final.
 - For each segment of the competition, the divers score will start at "0" points.
- The following dives will not be permitted in lists at Senior National Championships:

EXHIBITION EVENTS

Compulsory Showcase event - 3 meters and platform

At the 2025 Winter National Championships, the technical team introduced an exhibition event, specifically for synchronized selection purposes. To be eligible for any international synchronized competition during the year, athletes must participate in the Compulsory Showcase event. The Summer Senior National Championships will also include these exhibition events.

- The Compulsory Showcase events (men and women) will include 3 meters and platform.
 - ***Exhibition competition events are ONLY opened to junior and senior members of the National Team.
 - The eligible athlete list is available **HERE**.
 - (on diving.ca > Resources > Athletes > Junior and Senior Qualified Athletes).
- In these events, athletes must perform four (4) compulsory dives from groups 100, 200, 300 and 400, each with a degree of difficulty of 2.0.
 - The dives on the list may include:

3M & PLAT

101B, 103B, 401B, 403B, 201B, 301B

- These events will not be broadcasted.
- These events will not count toward the points calculation for the Senior National Championships' best club banner.
- In Platform, all dives must be done from 10m.

SELECTION

This championship will be the selection event for some international opportunities. All selection criteria will be available in the <u>Coaches Corner</u> and <u>Divers Corner</u>.

ENTRANCE CRITERIA, SENIOR POINT STANDARDS & QUALIFICATION

Winter Senior National Championship Events

To enter an event at the 2026 WSN, a diver shall have qualified on the basis of one (1) or more of the following criteria.

- Members of the current senior national team are qualified to compete in all events.
- A diver placing in the top-8 in any given event in any of the senior national championships or special senior trials events during the current and previous diving season will be qualified for that event.
- Divers who have equaled or surpassed the current season's senior national qualification standard in any given event at any designated qualifying competition held during the eighteen (18) months prior to the scheduled first day of national competition will be qualified for that event.
 - Women = 230 points on 3M and/or platform and 210 points on 1M
 - Men = 330 points on 3M and/or platform and 310 points on 1M
- Divers placing in the top-2 at a provincial senior qualification competition in their OWN province will be qualified for that event.
- Canadian divers in the NCAA program that have not qualified under 1 to 4 above, must apply to Diving Plongeon Canada for qualification for the national championships. To be considered, the diver must have qualified for their university zones/division championships in the current year and must submit their dive sheets and scores to the Diving Plongeon Canada office. DPC's Technical Leadership will make a decision on the diver's qualification. Please submit requests to andree@diving.ca and neris@diving.ca.

COACH CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR JUNIOR/SENIOR NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS AND TRIALS EVENTS

Coach Certification Status	Pool and Dryland Coaching Access
 Considered a 'Certified Responsible Coach': Competition Introduction - DPC screened and certified coach NCCP Level 2 Certified plus MED and DPC screened coach 	Permitted to coach at national championships/trials without restrictions.
 Considered a 'coach-in-training': Competition Introduction - DPC screened coach with a locker status of "In training" and completed MED or A Competition Introduction - DPC screened coach with a "trained" status and completed MED training 	May apply for a one-time exemption to be able to attend a national event with a Certified Responsible Coach. The Certified Responsible Coach is required to be on pool deck and in dryland training with the coach-in-training during training/competition at all times.
Non-NCCP certified Instruction Beginner Pre-Diving levels	Not permitted to coach at a national championships/trials. No possibility of exemptions.

If a coach from your club does not meet the required standard for a Certified Responsible Coach and instead falls within the possibility of obtaining a one-time exemption as a coach-in-training, please fill in the declaration form, which you can **download HERE**, and submit to Tracy (tracy@diving.ca) at least two weeks in advance to be considered for an exemption.

Failure to submit the form within the specified timeframe or attending a national championships or trials without a written exemption, will immediately disqualify the coach from being admitted as a coach-in-training on pool deck or within dryland areas.

The Certified Responsible Coach will need to provide direct supervision and take full responsibility for the actions of the coach-in-training while attending a national championships or trials, including, without limitation, in all diving-related activities on pool deck and in dryland training. The Certified Responsible Coach will be required to sign a release form declaring that they will take on the responsibility and assume liability for the coach-in-training at the event.

STATEMENT OF DIVES

MUST BE SUBMITTED <u>BEFORE 10AM ON DECEMBER 4TH</u>

Dive lists should be submitted using the ISS Dive Sheet Generator (Coach or Diver edition, **version 18** or higher). Download the new version HERE. A computer will also be set up on the pool deck on training days to fill out dive sheets.

For the exhibition events, dive sheets will submitted by hand on the pool deck.

RULE REMINDERS REGARDING STATEMENT OF DIVES FOR ALL CANADIAN NATIONAL EVENTS		
Deadline for submission of statement of dives	The statement of dives shall be submitted no later than 24 hours before the posted start time of the first event of the competition. Unless the statement is presented within the time prescribed, a diver shall not be admitted to the competition.	
Deadline for dive list change before an individual preliminary event or straight synchro final	In individual preliminary events, no changes to the statement of dives shall be permitted within 1 hour of the posted start time of the event	
Deadline for dive list change after an individual preliminary event for the finals	In all semi-final or final competitions, the diver or the diver's representative may change the statement of dives before the commencement of any semi-final or final of the competition, provided the amended statement is lodged with the Competition Secretariat, no later than thirty (30) minutes after the end of the previous session of the competition. If a new statement of dives is not submitted within the prescribed time, the diver shall perform the dives as indicated in the previous submission.

RULES

The new DPC Competition Regulations (also available under Resources > Rule book) shall be the official rules for this event. Any decisions made at this championship by the Jury of Appeal shall be final. The Competition Regulations and DPC Appeal Rules are also available on our website.

For club points and senior qualification scores, diver scores and rankings used will be based on 1st to 8th in the finals.

Non-Canadians and divers with other sports nationalities are eligible to compete in finals but cannot displace Canadian citizens.

JUDGING

Level 4 and 5 judges have been assigned to judge at the event. Local judges may be present on deck to shadow judge and observe. Event Referees will wear red tops and use electronic whistles. All judges will be required to wear white tops, black bottoms, and dark shoes. For finals long black pants are mandatory.

Please direct all judging questions and concerns to the meet referee.

AWARDS & MEDALS

We request that divers be dressed in full team uniform or club jacket for awards ceremonies and marshaling/athlete presentations, towels are not permitted. A full outfit (including pants, shorts, or leggings) is strongly recommended.

- There will be athlete presentations for all individual final events just before the first dive of each event.
- There will be no athlete presentations for exhibition events.

Awards to be given:

- Top-3 overall in individual events
- National championship banner (based on club points listed in the rules)
- Beverly Boys Award
 - The criteria for the Bev Boys Award combines the results of both WSN and SSN each year. The award will be presented at the SSN.
- There will be no medals for the exhibition events.

DOPING CONTROL

Doping control procedures may be in place at the competition.

Divers are responsible for bringing a photo ID (passport, school card), in case they get selected for doping control. A photocopy saved on their phone could be used. Divers are also responsible for any medication/supplement they are taking. Please check GlobalDro and follow the steps to verify if your medication is not allowed. If this is the case, please contact smayer@diving.ca to learn what needs to be done.
