


PLATFORMS

3M and 10M events for both men (6 dives without limit) and women (5 dives without limit) will be contested. These events will include a preliminary session, a repechage round, and a final.

SYNCHRONIZED EVENTS

3M and 10M events for both men (2 dives with limit + 4 dives without limit) and women (2 dives with limit + 3 dives without limit) will be contested.

These events will be contested as a straight final, and countries are permitted to enter one team per event, but a 2nd entry can be considered depending on event size.

Medals will be presented to the top-3 teams regardless of nationality.

MIXED TEAM EVENT

The Mixed Team Event diving competition consists of at least 1 female and 1 male diver but no more than 4 divers. 2 dives shall be executed by the female competitor and 2 dives by the male competitor. 2 dives shall be executed by a mixed synchronised team of 1 male and 1 female. 3 dives shall be executed from the 3m springboard and the other 3 dives from the 10m platform. 6 dives from 6 different groups must be used. The following rounds will be performed.

AQUA RECOGNIZED EVENT COMPETITION RULES

RULES

With the exception of the competition format mentioned on the previous pages, all other World Aquatics Rules are in place at the event (i.e. regarding judging, degrees of difficulty, dive groups, nationality, eligibility, etc.). You can find the World Aquatics Rules HERE.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- The Canada Cup of Diving shall be open to all AQUA affiliated Federations.
- Entries of divers in the Canada Cup of Diving shall be accepted only from the Federations, Members of AQUA.
- Divers age 12 and 13 years on December 31st of the same year shall be eligible to participate (as per age group C).
- The maximum number of divers who can participate in an individual event per nation is six (6).
- No additional divers or teams may participate, other than those specified in the Rules & Regulations. There will be no opportunity for exhibition places.

JUDGES

- The Event shall be judged by World Aquatics Certified Judges.
- Judging panels will have individuals from different countries, if possible.
- AQUA-certified judges will be used in the event additional judges are needed. If a National Federation is larger than 3 athletes, they are required to bring a judge.
- A Federation that does not provide a judge will be fined 500 USD, payable to the LOC.

TRAVEL INFORMATION

AIRPORT

There are two international airports situated near the event location and the City of Windsor.

- Recommended Option by the Local Organizing Committee:
 - Windsor International Airport (YQG)
 - All arrivals and departures should be done to/from the YQG Airport in Canada
 - The LOC will provide transfers to/from the YQG Airport.
 - The LOC will have an information booth in the international terminal. Please see Diving Canada's staff at the desk when arriving in Windsor or contact our transportation manager Neris Gonzalez Lopez via WhatsApp at +1 (514) 893-7572.
- Other Option Available:
 - o <u>Detroit Metropolitan Wayne County Airport (DTW)</u>
 - Teams who decide to book their flights to/from the DTW airport will be responsible for their own transfer to/from DTW airport.
 - The LOC will not be providing any transfers to/from the DTW Airport.
 - Some independent transfer services can be found below if teams want to select this option.

 - Please note that this airport is located in the United States and your group will need to obtain the appropriate documents to gain entry to the U.S. The LOC is not able to secure this on your behalf.

Applicable Rules

- The booking is to be made to the following city: Windsor, YQG (CA)
- The travel period begins Tuesday, March 31, 2026 and ends Sunday, April 19, 2026.
- Travel is valid Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, Sunday.
- In order to take advantage of the discounted fares, Eligible Passengers must book their flight at aircanada.com and enter the Promotion Code in the applicable box. If the Promotion Code is not entered or is entered incorrectly, the Discounts will not be applied to the booking. The applicable Promotion Code must be recorded on the Eligible Passengers 's ticket by ticketing agencies/airlines.





















VISA and eTA PROCESS

Citizens of most countries and territories need a VISA or an eTA to visit or transit Canada. We invite you to get in touch with us as soon as possible and to check the website below to know if you need an e-TA.

YOU WILL FIND DETAILED INFORMATION ON HOW TO PROPERLY APPLY FOR A VISA AND THE PROCESSING TIMES HERE.

Note. If you hold a passport other than Canadian or you are stateless, you need a visa to visit or transit in Canada. Canada has introduced a requirement for countries that previously did not require a visa to enter Canada. An Electronic Travel Authorization (eTA) is an entry requirement for visa-exempt foreign nationals travelling to Canada by air. An eTA is electronically linked to a traveller's passport. It is valid for up to five years or until the passport expires, whichever comes first.

Upon request sent to events@diving.ca, the LOC will provide visa assistance by issuing an invitation letter.

Please note that in the current context, we expect that issuing visas will take much longer than in the past and we urge you to begin this process as early as possible to avoid possible travel problems due to delays.

LOCAL TRANSPORTATION

WELCOME & ACCREDITATION

There will be someone from the LOC to welcome you at the airport, at the front entrance of the event venue, and the host hotel. Accreditations will be handed by the hotel manager upon arrival at he hotel if payment has been received by the HC. In order to facilitate your movement, the LOC will install an information booth at the hotel. Do not hesitate to connect with your hotel manager if you have any questions.

Accreditations will be provided to your Team Manager or Head Coach upon arrival at your host hotel. Your delegation will need their accreditation for entry/exit in the training facility to pass multiple security check points and to receive their meals. An accreditation station will be located at the pool beside the secretariat.

SPORT INFORMATION DESK

A Sport Information Desk will operate at the competition venue on all training and competition days. Please come see us in the LOC office on pool deck if you have any questions/concerns.

NOTE: All the withdrawal and correction forms must first be approved by the referee and then handed to the Secretariat of the competition.

MEDICAL SERVICES

Lifeguards will be on duty at all training/competition sessions and will act as the first responders.

A medical clinic offers service on a pay per use basis. A physician will be available to participants by contacting the organizing committee's medical services coordinator.

Physio tables will be available for visiting countries to use at both the competition venue and host hotel.

On-site medical services will be available to all participants from April 6th to 12th. In case of an emergency, the EMS will decide which hospital the patient will be transferred to depending on the type of injury or illness.

More information will be provided in a future communication.

DOPING CONTROL

Doping control procedures will be in place at the competition.

Divers are responsible for bringing government-issued photo ID (or a high-resolution copy) in case they are selected for doping control. Divers are also responsible for any medication/supplement they are taking. Athletes under 18 must have a chaperone from their team to accompany them during their test.
